# Baseball BC High-Performance Program 2023 Pathway Document

#### Introduction

## **Minimum Playing Time**

The following minimum playing time standards shall apply to all athletes.

Male Events	Minimum Playing Time
Development Tournaments	Pitchers – One outing Position players – 25% of the defensive innings
Summer Games & Canada Cup	Pitchers – One outing Position players – One start.

Female Events	Minimum Playing Time	
Westerns & Nationals	Pitchers – One outing.	
	Position players – One Start	

An athlete who is both a pitcher and a position player, need only receive the minimum playing time requirements in one of those capacities, not both.

An outing is defined as 40 pitches.

Unfortunately, a pitcher scheduled to start a medal round game, may not get an opportunity to pitch if the team does not qualify. This would not constitute a violation of this rule.

A position player start is defined as starting the game in a defensive position and being substituted no earlier than the 5<sup>th</sup> inning.

Players who are injured or being disciplined may not receive their minimum playing time.

## **Required Events on the High-Performance Pathway**

Regional or Zone Identification Camps are an athlete's entry point for high-performance programming. Unless exempted (as set out below), attendance at these camps is mandatory and athletes cannot receive an invitation to the Provincial Camp (Prospects or Selects) if they do not attend.

The Prospects Camp (14U/15U), Selects Camp (16U/17U), and Female Provincial Camp, are also mandatory events for athletes interested in being selected to Team BC. Unless exempted (as set out below), athletes who do not attend these events in their entirety, are not eligible for provincial team selection.

Athletes who played on the 2022 Baseball BC 15U or 16U male provincial teams are not required to attend the Regional Identification Camp and will receive an automatic invitation to the 2023 Select Camp.

## **Camp Exemptions**

An athlete who is injured or has another special circumstance may receive an exemption from attending all or part of a required camp.

Athletes currently participating in a Baseball Canada National Team program are eligible to receive camp exemptions.

Special Circumstances: Examples of special circumstances may include, but are not limited to, bereavement, school exams, and previously scheduled/committed college events. Special circumstances do not include, without limitation, scheduling conflicts with other sports, family holidays, and social engagements.

When an athlete is exempted, their evaluation will be based on feedback from coaches and past performance within the high-performance program. Being exempted allows the athlete to progress to the next stage in the high-performance program, but such progression is not guaranteed.

Requests for camp exemptions, outside of emergencies during a camp, must be made prior to the beginning of the camp, by email to the staff contact for high performance (Kyle Williams for male teams & Scott MacKenzie for female teams). Requests cannot be approved by coaches. A doctor's note or other supporting documentation may be required.

## Male Pathway (14U & 15U)

## Step One – Attend a Zone Identification Camp

Baseball BC will hold Zone Identification Camps throughout the province. Athletes must attend one evening camp within their zone, based on where they reside. There will be a minimum of three Zone Identification Camps within each zone.

The purpose of the Zone Identification Camps is to select athletes for the Baseball BC Summer Games (June 23-25) and Prospects Camp (September 2-4).

For 2023, zones 1, 2, 7, and 8 will be combined into a single zone.

#### <u>Step Two – Attend the Baseball BC Summer Games</u>

Baseball BC is introducing a new Summer Games event for 2023. Every two years (even years 2022, 2024, etc.), the British Columbia Summer Games Society organizes a multi-sport Summer Games event. One of the challenges with this event for baseball is that athletes who are in the 14U age bracket in the year the event is held, have a limited opportunity to participate because they are competing for roster spots against players who are a year older. Therefore, Baseball BC is creating their own version of the Summer Games in the years (odd years) between the official BC Summer Games events. The Baseball BC version of the Summer Games will look different from the event organized by the BC Summer Games Society in even years. It will be a single sport event, without the non-sports related aspects of the Summer Games. Athletes will be responsible for their own travel, meals, and accommodations.

From a competition standpoint, the Lower Mainland will be split into three zones (Fraser Valley, Fraser River, Vancouver-Coastal). Vancouver Island will be a zone, while the Kootenays, Thompson-Okanagan, North-West, and Cariboo-Northeast will be combined into one zone. Each Zone will select a sixteen player 14U team and a sixteen player 15U team, which will create a five-team tournament in each age division. Each team will play four round robin games and the top two teams will play in the finals. The 14U event will be played on an 80-foot diamond, while the 15U event will be played on a 90-foot diamond.

The Baseball BC Summer Games will be used to select athletes for the Prospects Camp. While it is not a required event on the high-performance pathway, participation is strongly recommended. Both the PBL and BC Minor have committed to support this event by not scheduling league games on the June 23-25 weekend.

## Step Three – Attend the Prospects Camp

The Prospects Camp is an intensive three-day event used to select athletes for Team BC 14U and 15U. Thirty-five athletes in each age category will be invited to the Prospects Camp.

#### Step Four – Play on Team BC 14U or 15U

Team BC 14U and 15U will each be comprised of 18 athletes. These teams will attend at least one event in September or October.



## **Male Pathway (16U & 17U)**

## <u>Step One – Attend a Regional Identification Camp</u>

Baseball BC will hold eight Regional Identification Camps throughout the province. Athletes must attend one of these camps. The purpose of the Regional Identification Camps is to select athletes for the Select Camp.

Athletes who played on the 2022 Baseball BC 15U or 16U male provincial teams do not attend Regional Identification Camps and progress directly to the Selects Camp.

## Step Two – Attend the Selects Camp

The Select Camp is an intensive four-day event used to select athletes for Team BC 16U and 17U. Thirty-five athletes in each age category will be invited to the Select Camp.

## Step Three – Play on Team BC 16U or 17U

Team BC 16U and 17U will each be comprised of 20 athletes. The 17U Select team plays in the Baseball Canada Cup, while the 16U team plays in an event on the Labour Day weekend in Alberta.


